Dear NAAL members,

The NAAL Academy Committee has just returned from Montreal for our pre-conference planning meeting, and we are overjoyed with our venue for January's meeting. The city is fully bi-lingual, making communication in either French or English a pleasure. Come prepared to dine in style! The food in Montreal is outstanding with culinary choices from many traditions. There are many historic churches in the city, and we have arranged for church tours during Saturday morning January 7. Our plan is to allow you to visit two or perhaps three churches in the time allowed. Many are within short walking distance from the hotel, some by way of underground passages. Look for tour sign-up possibilities on the on-line Registration form. We will also have recommendations for Shabbat on Friday and for Sunday morning services for those of you wishing to worship in the city before you leave.

As usual, we are looking forward to worshipping together in Montreal and have made plans for the following experiences. Of course we will have our interfaith opening and closing rites; the convention liturgy will be Evening Prayer in the Roman Catholic tradition, a morning prayer in the Byzantine tradition (Festal Matins for St. John Baptist), and the Ecology Seminar will be leading

Hotel Information

The Hyatt is a lovely hotel located across the Place des Arts. A Metro stop is located in the plaza but everything is very walk able. A downtown map indicating the hotel's location can be accessed here: <http://montreal.hyatt.com/hyatt/hotels/services/maps/index.jsp?icamp=propMapDirections>. In addition, the underground walkway is directly below the hotel. The underground walkway includes a mall with a food court, grocery store, pharmacy, liquor store and health clinic.

The room rate for Montréal is \$165 CD (\$169 USD) per night. I was able to negotiate with the hotel that the room rate will include breakfast and internet service for your stay in Montréal. You will be given a breakfast voucher at check in. To be able to access the internet you will need to sign up as if you are paying but the charges will be deducted from your final bill upon check out. Additionally the same internet access will

another morning service. Our opening rite will be at Christ Church Cathedral, the Anglican Church nearby the hotel, and we are awaiting confirmation for Evening Prayer in the Sacred Heart Chapel of Notre Dame Basilica. We are appreciative of both these communities in opening their doors to us.

This year we have the privilege of hearing Bishop Mark MacDonald the National Indigenous Bishop of the Anglican Church in a sidebar discussion of inculturation on Saturday January 7. Be sure to sign up on the Registration Page for a boxed lunch.

Once again, I remind you to get your passports in order in these next few months. AAA suggests that it takes four weeks to process a passport request. Please bring walking shoes, especially for your time in Old Montreal as the streets are the original cobble stones of the first settlement.

While we could spend all our time visiting the city, seminar time remains a priority for us and we will have 8 ½ hours of seminar time. The hotel has ample meeting room space, and you should enjoy the various amenities it provides.

For those of you beginning a new academic year and for those whose work goes on year round, I wish every blessing until we meet in Montreal.

I am working with Amtrak and United/Air Canada to negotiate a group rate. This rate will be published soon on both the registration site and the blog.

Meeting Registration Fees

The Annual Meeting Registration site will be available September 15. Fees for the Annual Meeting will be \$285 for Members and \$325 for Visitors. The late fee of \$335/\$375 begins November 16, 2012. \$375 will be the onsite registration fee for both Members and Visitors.

Dining Options

Most of the restaurants in Montréal and Old Montréal have large alfresco dining areas and reservations are typical. Since we will be in the city during the winter, the dining capacities will be significantly reduced. I highly recommend reservations for your evening dining experiences. There are too many great restaurants to list here but we will be adding recommendations to the blog shortly.

Your breakfast is part of the hotel package. For lunch options there are numerous conve-

niently located restaurants in the same block as the hotel as well as a food court below the hotel on the underground tunnel walkway.

Evening Entertainment

Some of you have expressed interest in attending a hockey game while in Montréal. I inquired about the schedule and ticketing process while there. Most of the tickets have been sold out for a month or more, however it was recommended that you check the Montréal Canadiens website the 15th of each month to inquire about tickets that will not be used. Airport Transportation

1. "L'Aerobus" is the shuttle service from the airport to the Montreal Central Bus Station. The shuttle will stop at 3 hotels before reaching the Bus Station. From there, a complimentary shuttle service is available to bring you to our hotel. \$13 CAD one way and \$22.75 CAD round trip. The shuttle operates 4:00am-11:30pm.

As we work together over the next few years, here are four ways you can help me as well:

- I enjoy talking with people and visiting at receptions. Since I cannot recognize people in crowds, I appreciate people that approach me. Since I cannot see faces or read nametags, please remind me of your name.
- Pointing and giving directions such as “that way” are not helpful. Try to be descriptive and concrete. It is inappropriate to take hold of my arm; instead, offer me your elbow.
- If you want to make sure I receive information, voicemail is better than email (or, if I don't respond to an email, give me a voicemail message to look for an email) and hard copy is better than file attachment.
- If you have questions and concerns about my disability, please share them with me. I am happy to respond to them.

Even as we anticipate our meeting in Montreal, I am learning about Albuquerque, and imagining NAAL's January 2013 annual meeting. As is our custom, I will host a sidebar conversation about Albuquerque during our Montreal meeting. If you are interested in serving on the local committee, or if you have ideas and suggestions, I hope that you will plan to join me for the sidebar, give me a call, or drop me an email.
